Nature of the tasks:

The vacancy offered is in the Ethics team within BEPA, which notably supports the European Group on Ethics in Science and New Technologies (EGE). The tasks of the SNE are as follows:

- To provide intelligence and early warning on scientific-technical and ethical-societal developments
- To prepare briefings, visits, speeches and presentations upon request
- To provide support to coordination tasks of the European Group on Ethics
- To liaise with internal and external stakeholders on matters related to science & technology and to engage with civil society
- To organize and participate in the regular (monthly) meetings of the Group



Nature of the tasks:

Who we are:

We are a highly motivated team of around 15 professionals including economists, lawyers, natural scientists and engineers working in the political spotlight. Tackling climate change is our core business. We work on climate financing and issues related to deforestation and land use, both in the international climate negotiations and within the EU. Accordingly, the team in CLIMA.A.2 spearheads the development of EU and international solutions for mobilising climate finance. We also work on the development of EU and international emission reduction policies related to agriculture and forestry. Furthermore, our Unit represents the Commission in the international climate negotiations on Land Use and Land Use Change and Forestry (LULUCF) and on reducing emissions from deforestation and forest degradation in the tropics (REDD+). Our unit has taken the lead in transposing the Durban decision on LULUCF into EU domestic legislation and is responsible for the implementation and the further development of the EU's internal policy framework for LULUCF. We work in close collaboration with Member States in the Council and the Climate Change Committee.

Main areas of responsibility:

The national expert will work in the team on forestry and land use issues. The focus would be on providing input – through internal briefings and reporting – to the implementation of the LULUCF decision, as well as on the design of future policy initiatives through which the mitigation contribution of the land use sector domestically and internationally can be enhanced. The national expert would be involved in the preparatory work and discussions with Member States about LULUCF (e.g. in the context of the Working Group of the Climate Change Committee), forward-looking climate aspects related to the land use sector in the context of the 2030 climate and energy package, and discussions about the further mainstreaming of climate action into the EU's Common Agricultural Policy. In early 2014 scrutinising the draft rural development programmes of Member States from a climate point of view will be another possible task.

The work consists essentially in preparing the Commission's position on concentrations falling under the Merger Regulation. 1 Nature of the tasks:

DG Trade conducts the EU's common commercial policy and ensures that trade policy contributes to the Union's wider policy goals such as growth and jobs; while supporting development. The Chief Economist and Trade Analysis Unit contributes to this task by providing policy advice and economic analysis to trade policy makers in the DG.
